Committee accomplishments since previous UFS Plenary

- SUNY Virtual Research Day.
 - The goal of this endeavor is to organize a SUNY-wide research conference wherein graduate students have the opportunity to present their research to a diverse audience of SUNY faculty and students. A subcommittee met with Lisa Raposo from SUNY to discuss available platforms for hosting such an event. Several possible platforms were proposed and it was also brought to the committee's attention that the SURC conference will employ one such platform. The committee will subsequently focus on developing a conference format with the ultimate goal of scheduling the virtual research day for the Fall 2021 or Spring 2022 semester.
